- The Host is responsible for the entire Large Group in terms of making sure the bedrooms are cleaned, the Lodge is cleaned (particularly heavy usage areas like the kitchen, bar and living room) and that those guests know and follow all the club rules like any other guest must.

Heating

Please don't adjust the numbered temperature valves and vents on any club radiators yourself. Kudos to Cindy Darcy and Peter Hardman who are continuing to try to better balance our vintage steam heating system with new vents and valves. Just recently, the upper dorm has gone from Freeze Miser cold to Heat Miser hot. We are making adjustments for this and other issues, but reports of late show much better balance in the building, including warmer motels. Also, there are now supplemental heaters in certain motels set up on circuits that can handle the power draw. Please leave those in place and turn them off when you are not at the club.

I've made some small additions to the [online story of the Ski Club's history](#). If you haven't read the interesting online essay written by an un-named club member about our club's history, I encourage you to [check it out](#), especially if you're a newer member. I'm hoping to soon add some updated paragraphs to describe the club's more recent progress over the last 20 or so years.

While doing some research into the history of the club, Caren Connell and I have located some great old news articles that I will be including on the last page of the next few Yodelers. We believe it will be a great way to celebrate and highlight our 65-year history, and a reminder that being a family in the Club is something unique and special.

This month, we've located a copy of what we believe was the original article that was placed in the Lexington Minute-Man newspaper on November 19, 1964 by founding member John Adams to solicit some interest from local ski enthusiasts to create a ski club in Lexington. The first meeting must have been quite an event, as it was headlined by the [Stratton Mountain Boys](#), a musical group made up of ski instructors from Vermont. This self-proclaimed "number one Octoberfest band" went on to release several albums, and later performed at the 1996 Olympics, at the White House for at least one President, and "at every single Boston Ski Show." The club's first meeting also promised to feature Lexington locals Yodeling and [Schuhplattler dancing](#). Given our founder's love of yodeling, it's now evident how our newsletter got its name! Even an album cover of the Stratton Mountain Boys featured two huge alphorns for Yodeling.



The 1964 news article notes that the club's "long range plans include instructive meetings, ski trips, and individual ski trips for the different age groups, *and eventually even a ski lodge.*" Think about that and reflect on how far we've come from that meeting announcement in November of 1964! Cheers to John Adams for kickstarting this great organization that we're all fortunate to be part of.

Over the next month please be on the lookout for my call for Finance Committee volunteers. For those who may be newer to the Club, the committee meets annually and is tasked with preparing the proposed

budget for membership vote in the spring. The main component of this process is determining, and proposing, the following year's membership dues. This is a great opportunity for all members, new and old, to better understand the overall finances of the Club and offer their opinions and input on its' future direction. I can assure you; participation requires no financial background!

While not done by committee, I will also begin work on the projected offseason spending capacity of the Club so the Lodge Chair may begin planning. The past few off-seasons have afforded us the ability to make significant improvements to the Club infrastructure. As a result, we have spent down many of the funds accumulated during the COVID period (EIDL proceeds and insurance settlement). I will prepare and provide an overview for the membership of our current standing at our next meeting. My key objective in planning ahead is to create a longer-term, sustainable, plan of improvements.

Lastly, I'd like to thank our departing Board members. As we all know, the Club operates fully on volunteerism, and I have witnessed first-hand the contributions of my fellow board members. Marc has worked to bring the Club south, organizing countless outings allowing Club members to spend more time together over the prior years. Caren has worked diligently, alongside many of you, to proactively market the Club and grow our membership to levels not seen over the prior ten years.

SECRETARY REPORT

At the January meeting, the e-board proposed changing the by-laws so that there are no medical excuses from work weekend requirements. Members must either complete the work weekend requirement or pay the work weekend buyout fee. Reason: The medical excuse was appropriate when there was no buyout option. Many of the recent medical excuses came up at the very end of the work weekend schedule. Members who wish to avoid the buyout fee should attend one of the earlier work weekends to avoid an injury hampering their plans. The membership discussed this proposal.

The proposed wording for this change is as follows: (text to remove is in **red)**

Members whose conduct is unbecoming at any Club function will be subject to suspension or expulsion on recommendation of the Membership Committee to the Executive Board or by the Executive Board on its own motion, by the vote of a majority of the Executive Board. ~~Failure to complete a work weekend without prior consent from the Lodge Chair or the Executive Board is to be considered grounds for membership suspension or expulsion.~~ The conduct of guests will be deemed the conduct of their accompanying or sponsoring members.

Additionally: The lodge rules would be changed as follows: (added wording is in **highlight)**

2.1 Members must complete their work weekend obligation by December 1 **or pay the buyout fee.**

~~2.2—Members may be excused from the work weekend requirement for good cause with the approval from the Lodge Chair or Executive Committee. Members must notify the Lodge Chair and/or the Executive Committee in writing of their need for such consideration prior to the last work weekend of the fall season.~~

The e-board also proposed changing the minimum age of derivative members from 25 to 21. Reason: When the Junior Membership age was changed from (18 to almost-21) to (21 to almost-25), the goal was to leave everything else unaffected. Cindy found one edge case that was negatively affected:

A family is a member in the club for a number of years and resigns from the club when one of their children is age 20; Let's name him "Sam". (Imagine they are moving out of New England). One to three years later, Sam moves back to New England and wants to join the club as a Derivative member. Back when Junior Memberships were for ages [18-21], the minimum age for a Derivative Member was 21, so Sam could join. When we changed the Derivative Membership to be for ages [21-25], we also raised the minimum age for Derivative Membership to 25, thinking about the expected most common case of a family keeping membership through the adult child going through ages [18-25] and the adult becoming a Derivative Member at age 25 or older. We did not think about the edge case illustrated by "Sam", and "Sam" is not allowed to join until he reaches age 25.

Making this change does mean that age (21-24) children of current club members have the option of both Junior Membership and Derivative Membership. The assumption is that they will choose the Junior Membership option, as it is much cheaper and does not have a work weekend requirement. (Chris White says he is very happy to take the check of any young member who would like to pay the larger fee and have the work weekend responsibility.)

The membership discussed this proposal.

The proposed wording for this change is as follows: (text to remove is in red, added text is **highlighted**)

B. **Derivative Membership:** An unmarried person who is ~~twenty-one (21)~~ **twenty-five (25)** years of age or older at the start of the Club's fiscal year, has been a member for at least one fiscal year immediately after turning 18 to 24, and is interested in skiing, is eligible for Derivative Membership and may attain membership when approved in the manner designated.

Both proposals will be discussed and voted on at the March membership meeting.

A Quorum was established.

The meeting was called to order at 7:36 p.m. by President Kristen Butler.

Motion 1: (Darcy/Garrigus) Motion to accept the minutes from the meeting on Nov 19, 2024.
36 in favor / 0 opposed. Motion carries.

Treasurer: At this point in the ski season, the club is at the point where the income (from guest fees and meal fees) are larger than our operating expenditures; the club's finances are on target for where they should be. The replacement of the water heaters was an unplanned expenditure, that came from our Capital Expense Fund.

Chris White received a \$5000 check from NH Electric which is a rebate for part of the project of installing electric car chargers.

A cook has been hired for the season – Patrick. If there are any meal issues, please talk to the **host(s)** for the weekend, and let them handle the issue. (Members should stay out of the kitchen unless on meal duty or a host.) Because Patrick does not have his own transportation, members have been giving him (and his granddaughter) rides home after he's done cooking. The club will offer to pay for shuttle service, especially for getting to the club.

A few members have outstanding work weekend buyout fees to pay; Chris will be sending reminders soon. Chris White would like to find a new accountant to work with; finding a CPA willing to work with small non-profit organizations can be challenging, so if you know of such a person, please share their contact info with Chris.

Chris White is looking for an assistant treasurer to help with some of the work. Please contact him if you are interested in the position.

Reservation forms, although not perfect, are coming in with many fewer errors than last seasons.

Members and hosts: please continue to take time and care to get the forms filled out correctly, especially when making changes by hand on a paper form at the lodge.

Social: The December Holiday party was well attended with 41 families attending (this includes prospective members).

Betsy Stanford, Sue Gardner and Irene Gravina are working on planning the club's 60th Anniversary Party, tentatively set for Sept 27. Members will be able to buy tickets to attend.

This coming weekend (Jan 25) will be Robert Burns night – wear your plaid and enjoy scotch and poetry.

Feb 1 will be Tropical night – pull out your Hawaiian shirt, and similar wear. Feb 8-9 is the Women's X-CC weekend and the theme for happy hour is Disco. Pizza night might be done during February vacation – stay tuned. More ideas for themes are welcome, just reach out to Marc Garrigus.

The Franconia Ski Club is hosting “A Good Night Out” on Feb 8 to raise money. Cash bar, live and silent auction, food included, adults only. Details at <https://www.franconiaskiclub.com/goodnightout>

Twin Barns Brewing Company (99 Main St, North Woodstock, NH) is running a contest for ski clubs. If you have a beer there, tell them you are from the Lexington Ski Club, and they will add your drink to our tally.

The club who drinks the most there “wins”; we don't know if there is any prize other than bragging rights.

Membership: The Dennis family has joined the club! We now have 51 active member families, 3 alumni families, and 2 derivative members. There are 10 prospective member families, and all of them have attended at least one meeting. Seven have made at least one visit to the lodge, and 2 have not visited yet but have plans to do so.

Looking at the number of families that need bunk beds (because some/all of their children are too young to sleep in a dorm) and the usage pattern of club members, the club will probably stick with the 55-member family limit and put additional families onto a wait list. Each year the club has an average of 4.5 member families resign or go inactive, so a good portion of the wait list is likely to be offered membership this summer (after July 1). The E-board will continue to examine the numbers and usage patterns over the remainder of the ski season.

The Membership Committee met and discussed how to reach more people in towns where we have very few members, such as Belmont and Bedford. (Caren Connell can supply you with a blurb to post if you know of an appropriate Facebook group, e-mail list, or other forum to share it on.) They are reviewing the documentation given to prospective member families.

Lodge Report: The water heaters have been replaced.

The new electric car chargers are working. After charging, if the cable is too stiff to put on the hook, place it **behind** the charging post, rather than letting it extend into the parking space where it could be hit by a plow blade.

Christian bought electric candles to use for dinners. Kids love setting them out, collecting them and turning them on or off, so feel free to ask kid(s) for help with this task.

Christian is working on getting the Lodge Committee going again. (**Reminder:** all new members are required to have one adult serve on either the Lodge Committee or the Membership Committee during their first year as members. During the second year, members are required to have one adult serve on a committee of your choice.)

Reservation Committee: Reservation forms for the February vacation period are due Monday, January 27.

Hosts: please make sure to send the requested information to the reservation committee in the requested time frame.

General Business: Some rooms are not being properly cleaned. Directions are posted in every room. Please do **every** step on **every** stay. Check under the beds and all around the room for any of your items. Members are responsible for making sure any guests they host have properly cleaned. (If they do not clean properly, you have to fix it.)

Clarification for handling of prospective members: First, vocabulary: a “sponsor” is one of two families assigned to advise and help a prospective member family through the process (and must write a letter of recommendation for the family). A “host” for a prospective member family's visit to the lodge is the person who submits a reservation form for them, welcomes them at the lodge, shows them the various parts of the lodge, pays the club for their stay, and generally helps them through their visit. (A sponsor can also host prospective member families' visits.) When a prospective member family wants to stay at the lodge and none of their sponsors are planning to be at the lodge at that time period, one of the sponsors should work with the Membership Chair to find someone to host them for their stay.

If you want to leave a meal duty before it is completed, you need to talk to **all** members assigned to the duty to get their agreement.

If an entire family (and all their guests) have specified “meal not taken” for a given meal at the lodge, the reservation committee will not assign that family to have a duty for that meal. This is to allow people to plan in advance to do things like drive to mountains much farther away or eat a meal with friends away from the lodge.

Reminders: All of members' (and their guests') non-refrigerated food must be stored in a plastic bin in the cabinets in the bar area, not in a bag or out loose. This is to avoid attracting mice. There are extra bins in the bar area for use by guests and members who have forgotten their bin.

A Few Turns Down Memory Lane:

An article from the November 19, 1964 edition of the Lexington Minute-Man newspaper, announcing the first meeting of the Lexington Ski Club, to be held at the Belfry Club on Muzzey St in Lexington.

November 19, 1964



First Ski Club Meeting Monday

The first meeting of the Lexington Ski Club is being

scheduled for Monday night, Nov. 23, at 8 p.m. at the Old Belfry Club, Muzzey st. It is to be an informal introductory meeting and get together of

the skiing enthusiasts of this town.

Young and old alike are invited to attend what is hoped to be very enjoyable entertainment including yodelling, and schuhplatteln.
